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The Parks and Recreation Department is dedicated to delivering parks and recreation services that improve the quality of life in New Brighton. As identified in our strategic plan, we will strive to do the following:

IMPROVING HEALTH

- 1,643 individuals attended group fitness classes April 1-May 19.
- 612 softball players participated in 7 adult leagues each week in May. The leagues are held Monday through Friday at the following fields: Lions, Freedom, Sunny Square and Veterans.
- 30 participants are registered for the May session of swimming lessons.
- All golf leagues at Brightwood Hills are in play – with the exception of the two summer junior programs that start once school is out. Participation levels are higher in each and every league compared to the last two golf season.

PROTECTING NATURAL RESOURCES

- Trees have been transplanted from the Maintenance Building grounds to NBCC, the New Brighton Exchange area and well houses.

FOSTERING HEALTHY YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

- On May 19, twenty-three participants attended the Eagles Nest after hours 'event from 5:30-7:30 pm. Seventeen individuals pre-registered for the event and nine paid a drop in fee. The event grew by twenty-one participants since January 27.
- 41 children, ages 3-14 attended martial arts classes at the community center each week in May.
- 49 children, ages 3-14 attended the gymnastic sampler class in May to strengthen their coordination and balance.
- The 4th and 5th grade track program was held in May at Bel Air School with 130 kids participating.
- Nine beginners, ages 4-12 are taking tennis lessons at Hansen Park
- Youth Sports Coaches Meetings were held on May 20. Approximately 50 head and assistant coaches attended the meetings where materials were distributed, rules were reviewed and proper personal conduct was explained.
- Brightwood Hills completed the After School Golf Program after two weather related postponements. A record number of 41 youth participated this spring!

SUSTAINING FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

- Staff attended a free training at the Bureau of Mediation Services on Dealing with Conflict.

SUPPORTING COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT

- Roof repairs were completed to the metal roof of the Eagles Nest at NBCC. These repairs included sealing the seams and installing snow guards.
